# From The Desk of ... Assessor Mark Malay Know Your Assessment Exemptions

### All Homeowners...

#### » RESIDENTIAL EXEMPTION

- You must own and occupy the home as your primary residence as of Jan. 1st.
- To see if you are already receiving this exemption, look at your most recent tax bill.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$6,000.

#### » DISABLED PERSONS EXEMPTION

- Must be owner of record and primary residence.
- A person with a medically determinable physical or mental impairment that is expected to last for a continuous period of at least 12 months.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$2,000.

#### » HOME IMPROVEMENT EXEMPTION

- If you make an improvement to your primary residence that results in an increase in your assessed value you may qualify for this exemption.
- Addition, New garage, deck, patio, shed or other structural change may qualify.
- This is a four year exemption with a maximum amount of the exemption is \$25,000 in assessed value (\$75,000 in Market Value).

### If you are a Veteran...

#### » RETURNING VETERAN EXEMPTION

- Any Veteran returning from active duty in an armed conflict.
- Must be the Veteran's primary residence and must be owner of record.
- Only available in the year returning from the active duty.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$5,000.

#### » DISABLED VETERANS' EXEMPTION

- Applicant must be a Veteran with at least 50% service related disability as certified by the US Dept. of Veterans Affairs.
- Veteran must own and occupy as primary residence.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value as follows.
- 30%-49% disability is \$2,500
- 50%-69% disability is \$5,000
- 70% disability is exempt up to a max assessed value of \$250,000.

### If you are or will be 65 years old or more this year...

#### » SENIOR HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

- Can apply any time during the year that you turn 65. Best to do before October 1st.
- Simple 1 page application at the Assessor or County offices.
- Need to bring Driver's License and Deed if possible.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$5,000.
- Annual renewal card comes in mail each spring.

#### » SENIOR ASSESSMENT FREEZE

- Freezes taxable value of property. Amount of exemption is the difference between current assessment and frozen value.
- Must have a total household income of less than \$55,000.
- Apply before October 1st at Assessor or County Office.
- Must be applied for each year.

# From The Desk of ... Sheriff John E. Zaruba New Law and Pilot Program

heriff Zaruba and members of The DuPage County Sheriff's Office

were honored to receive a generous donation from the Annie LeGere Foundation for the purchase of EpiPens for Deputies to carry. The LeGere family tragically lost their daughter Annie to an allergic reaction in August 2015. Had an EpiPen been available to law enforcement at that time, it may have saved her life. Annie's Law was passed in August 2016 and authorizes law enforcement to administer an EpiPen. The Law goes into effect in January 2017.

Sheriff Zaruba is proud to be the pilot Law Enforcement Agency for the EpiPen Program. The donation from the LeGere Foundation will be used to buy and equip deputies.

### BASIC NEEDS ASSISTANCE

### LIHEAP PROGRAM

LiHeap (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) applications will be taken at the township office through May **31st or until the \$\$ is spent.** Eligible households are determined by household size, income, geographical location and type of fuel used. An overdue bill or disconnect notice is not required.

Appointments are required. Call 630-231-3591, 9 am to 3 pm, Monday through Friday to schedule an application

**appointment.** You will be required to bring proof of SS#s for all members of the household, your latest gas and electric bills, proof of income for all household members for the 30 days prior to the date of your application and your lease, if you rent. You will need to continue paying your heating bills while you are pending a decision on your application.



### ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE

There are churches and pantries in Winfield Township which may be able to assist in an emergency. A list is available by request through the General Assistance Office at 630-231-3591.

# WINFIELD TOWNSHIP Senior & Disabled Bus Service

### Transportation service is available Monday through Friday 8:15 am to 4:30 pm

Ride availability is on a first-call, first served basis the day before you are to ride. Cost is \$4.00 per round trip per person and you are allowed 3 stops. The bus travels within Township boundaries. Please check our website or call the number listed below for additional information or closings due to holidays. Must be registered to ride the bus.



### SALVATION ARMY FUNDS

Salvation Army funding is again available to residents of Winfield Township. One must meet the income guidelines used for Emergency Assistance provided by the township and as in all other programs, an appointment is required. Walk-ins cannot be accommodated. Proof of residency in Winfield Township (West Chicago south of Hawthorne Lane or Winfield) must be provided along with proof of SS#s along with other general information about the family. Call 630-231-3591 to schedule.

# Emergency Assistance Program

**EA is available every 18 months with a lifetime limit of 3 times.** You must live within the boundaries of Winfield Township and have income at 150% of the Federal Poverty Level or less. For rental assistance there must be a 5-day notice in order to consider it an emergency. While the LIHEAP program is in effect, the township can't assist with gas or electric bills. Water bills are eligible year round if there is a Final Notice Prior to Disconnection.

### HOLIDAY/ADOPT-A-FAMILY PROGRAM 2017

Donations made to the Holiday programs were used to purchase grocery gift cards from Aldi and Jewel for the families who are registered with us for the holidays and also those we may encounter after the close of the holiday program. Games, toys, gloves and hats, and gift cards were also



donated by generous residents of the township.

98 families were mailed Holiday Registration forms in October and 72 families returned the forms which made them eligible to be "adopted" by another family, a business or a church. This year all family registrations were assigned.

Four children from Winfield Township participated in the "Shop with Law Enforcement" program organized by the DuPage County Sheriff's Office. The children were accompanied by law enforcement personnel who assisted them in shopping for themselves and their family members.

Several families were invited to "shop" from The Christmas Store which is supported by several churches in the area. The feedback from these families was "very positive."

# From The Desk of ... Supervisor Dona L. Smith Coast2coast Rx Program Passes \$350,000 In Savings

infield Township has been offering the Coast2Coast Rx Card, (this FREE prescription drug card can benefit your entire family) since September 2011. 5,680 prescriptions have been filled using the Winfield Township Rx Discount Card saving residents over \$351,589. Winfield Township is celebrating its fifth anniversary of participation in this beneficial program.

While the card is generally for people without any prescription coverage, in many cases it may offer better pricing than certain health insurance plans. It is important for residents to compare pricing whether or not they have insurance. Some medications may not be covered in other health plans that may be covered by the Coast2Coast Rx Card.

The program is now offering additional discounts for dental, vision and hearing along with those currently available

for lab and imaging tests. You can pickup this card at the



There are over 59,000 participating pharmacies including all major chains and many independent pharmacies. Ask your pharmacist if the Coast2Coast program could save you money.
