
RECYCLING EXTRAVAGANZA

Crime Prevention at Home

Lights and Alarm- Having an outside light can deter criminals who use the cover of darkness to commit crimes undetected. Turning on an outside light can be a deterrent and light your property. An alarm can be a deterrent and also contacts police if the alarm is set off when you are away.

Doors- You might keep the deadbolt locked on the front door at all times, but what about the back door off the patio? Or maybe you leave the garage door wide open during the afternoons? Be as conscientious about your less-used entrances as you are with your main one. Also reinforce sliding doors with a sliding lock or even a metal or wood piece along the rails can be effective.

Keys and Valuables- That bowl or basket where everyone tosses keys, wallets, phones and other valuables may also help criminals. Sure, you'll know where they are—but so will a burglar. The best place for car keys is beside your bed. If you wake up to noises that sound like someone breaking in, hit the alarm on the fob to scare the criminal away. No one likes to get locked out, but a spare key stashed under a rock or above the door frame is bound to be discovered, so exchange yours with a neighbor you trust in case of emergency.

Automobile- Lock your car doors and close all windows on your automobiles. Never leave your keys in your vehicle! Also make sure to take all valuables and paperwork with personal information. Most auto burglaries occur on unlocked automobiles.

Friends, Followers, and Fiends- When you're out of town have a neighbor pick up your mail and stop

newspaper delivery so thieves won't see them piling up. Also block any social media posts to the public that may say you are out of town or not at home. All a burglar has to do is look up your address and then leisurely go to your home, knowing you won't be back from Italy until Sunday.

Know Your Property Tax Exemptions

All Homeowners...

» RESIDENTIAL EXEMPTION

- You must own and occupy the home as your primary residence as of Jan. 1st.
- To see if you are already receiving this exemption, look at your most recent tax bill.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$6,000.

» DISABLED PERSONS EXEMPTION

- Must be owner of record and primary residence.
- A person with a medically determinable physical or mental impairment that is expected to last for a continuous period of at least 12 months.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$2,000.

» HOME IMPROVEMENT EXEMPTION

- If you make an improvement to your primary residence that results in an increase in your assessed value you may qualify for this exemption.
- Addition, New garage, deck, patio, shed or other structural change may qualify.
- This is a four year exemption with a maximum amount of the exemption is \$25,000 in assessed value (\$75,000 in Market Value).

If you are a Veteran...

» RETURNING VETERAN EXEMPTION

- Any Veteran returning from active duty in an armed conflict.
- Must be the Veteran's primary residence and must be owner of record.
- Only available in the year returning from the active duty.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$5,000.

» DISABLED VETERANS' EXEMPTION

- Applicant must be a Veteran with at least 30% service related disability as certified by the US Dep. of Veterans Affairs.
- Veteran or surviving unmarried spouse of disabled veteran must own and occupy as primary residence. The property cannot have a value of more than \$750,000.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value as follows:
 - » 30%-49% disability is \$2,500
 - » 50%-69% disability is \$5,000
 - » 70% disability is exempt up to a max assessed value of \$250,000.

Will you be 65 or more this year...

» SENIOR HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

- Can apply any time during the year that you turn 65. Best to do before October 1st.
- Simple 1 page application at the Assessor or County offices.
- Need to bring Driver's License and Deed if possible.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$5,000.
- Annual renewal card comes in mail each spring.

» SENIOR ASSESSMENT FREEZE

- Freezes taxable value of property.
 Amount of exemption is the difference between current assessment and frozen value.
- NEW FOR 2018 Must have a total household income of \$65,000 or less.
 The income limit changed for 2018 Application, it was \$55,000.
- Apply before October 1st at Assessor or County Office.
- Must be applied for each year.



BASIC NEEDS ASSISTANCE

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

General Assistance is a program which provides a minimum grant for individuals who live in Winfield Township and do not fit into other categories for assistance from the State or Federal Government. There is a work component attached to this grant.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Emergency Assistance is administered to persons once in a twelve month period with a lifetime max of 5 times. Applicant must be a Township resident who has received a five day notice and/or utility disconnection notice. Must meet all financial and non-financial requirements.

LIHEAP PROGRAM


LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) is a program that assists eligible households in paying their gas and/or electric bills. Eligibility is determined by household size, income, and geographical location. This program runs through May 31, 2018 or until the funds run out.

ACCESS DUPAGE

Access DuPage is a program to help eligible persons in DuPage County receive primary care medical services.

BIG WOODS CEMETERY

Located on Eola Road, is maintained by Winfield Township. Plots are available for purchase. The price of a adult grave ranges from \$1,200 to \$1,3500. The price of a cremation ranges from \$800 to \$950, and the price for an infant grave ranges from \$375 to \$450. Wrap Up of Holiday Assistance Program

Thank you to all who helped make this a happy Christmas for those facing difficult financial times.

Eighty-four families were invited to participate in the Winfield Township Holiday Assistance Program. The names came from the Township Emergency Assistance Program and the local food pantry. Forty-two families were assigned to donors. Each donor shopped for the family and provided them with a gift card for a holiday meal.

Twenty-seven families were invited to shop at the Christmas Store, of which twelve families made an appointment to shop. This program has new items that have been purchased or donated. The parents shop for their children and enjoy snacks while volunteers giftwrap their items.

Four children (between the ages 7 and 11) were also invited to shop with law enforcement. Each child got picked up at their home by an officer who volunteered his/her time to take the child shopping for his/her family.

infield Township is proud to offer our senior and/or disabled bus service. This program has been in existence since 1974, with our current bus driver, Terry Klingberg, driving since 1977.

The service is available for those age 65 and older and/or disabled (18 and older) who reside within Winfield Township. Proof of age and Winfield Township residency, and disability, if appropriate, are required. We currently have 256 regular riders and 25 caregiver riders registered for our program.

If you qualify for the program and have not signed up yet all you need to do is come in to our 130 Arbor Avenue office and complete the form and bring in proof of residency and age. The forms are in our office and can also be printed off our website www.winfieldtownship.com.

- Ride availability is on a first-call, first serve basis the day before you are to ride. Cost is \$4.00 (cash only) per roundtrip per person and you are allowed 3 stops.

• The bus travels within Township boundaries.


