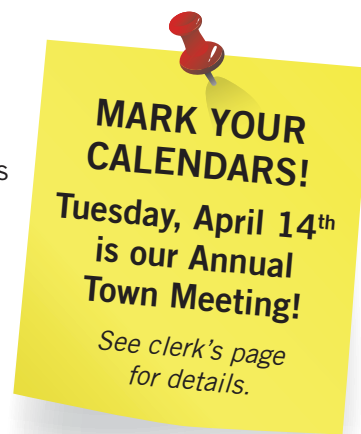

## SUPPORT POLLINATORS WITH A SLOW SPRING CLEANUP

As the weather begins to warm and we all look forward to getting our yards and gardens ready for the season. It's important to remember that many pollinators are still resting in our landscapes. Bees, butterflies, and other beneficial insects often spend the winter tucked inside hollow plant stems, leaf litter, and other natural materials left in our yards.

Rushing into spring cleanup too early can disturb or even harm these important pollinators before they have a chance to emerge. Experts recommend waiting until nighttime temperatures consistently reach 50°F or higher before cutting back plants or removing leaves. By allowing a little extra time, you help give pollinators the chance to wake up naturally and begin their important work.

Pollinators play a critical role in our environment by helping plants grow, supporting local ecosystems, and even contributing to the foods we eat. Leaving stems standing and keeping some leaf cover a bit longer in the spring provides essential shelter during this transition from winter to warmer weather.

A "slow spring cleanup" is a simple way to support nature right in your own yard. When temperatures warm consistently, you can begin trimming plants and preparing your garden for the season—knowing you've helped protect the pollinators that keep our community blooming.

If you qualify for the program and have not signed up yet all you need to do is come in to our 130 Arbor Avenue office and complete the form and bring in proof of residency and age. ## KNOW YOUR PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

### ALL HOMEOWNERS...

#### Residential Exemption

- You must own and occupy the home as your primary residence as of Jan. 1st.
- To see if you are already receiving this exemption, look at your most recent tax bill.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$8,000.

#### Disabled Persons Exemption

- Must be owner of record and primary residence.
- A person with a medically determinable physical or mental impairment that is expected to last for a continuous period of at least 12 months.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$2,000.

#### Home Improvement Exemption

- If you make an improvement to your primary residence that results in an increase in your assessed value you may qualify for this exemption.
- Addition, new garage, deck, patio, shed or other structural change may qualify.
- This is a four-year exemption with a maximum amount of the exemption is \$25,000 in assessed value (\$75,000 in Market Value).

### IF YOU ARE A VETERAN...

#### Returning Veteran Exemption

- Any Veteran returning from active duty in an armed conflict.
- Must be the Veteran's primary residence and must be owner of record.
- Only available in the year returning from the active duty.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$5,000.

#### Disabled Veterans Exemption

- **NEW 2024** any member of the US Armed Forces during WWII. (Does not require disability rating.)

- Applicant must be a Veteran with at least 30% service-related disability as certified by the US Dept. of Veterans Affairs.
- Veteran or surviving unmarried spouse of disabled veteran must own and occupy as primary residence. The property cannot have a value of more than \$750,000.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value as follows.
  - 30%-49% disability is \$2,500
  - 50%-69% disability is \$5,000
  - 70% or more of disability is exempt for the first \$250,000 of equalized assessed value of the residential property.

### WILL YOU BE 65 OR MORE THIS YEAR...

#### Senior Homestead Exemption

- Can apply any time during the year that you turn 65. Best to do before October 1st.
- Simple 1-page application at the Assessor or County offices.
- Need to bring Driver's License and Deed if possible.
- This exemption reduces the net taxable value by \$8,000.
- Annual renewal information will be sent to prior year exemption recipients each spring.

#### Senior Assessment Freeze

- Freezes taxable value of property. Amount of exemption is the difference between current assessment and frozen value.
- Must have a total household income of \$65,000 or less. **\*NEW for 2026 Application (using 2025 income) – new household limit \$75,000**
- Apply before October 1st at Assessor or DuPage County Supervisor of Assessments Office.
- Starting in 2020 applications will not require a notary.
- Must be applied for each year.

for any public records that are subject to disclosure.

Additionally, this office currently offers a *Medical Lending Closet*, voter registration, notarization of documents and *Senior Health Insurance Program counseling through the Illinois Department on Aging* (Signing up for Medicare). # GENERAL ASSISTANCE

### General Assistance

General Assistance is a program which provides a minimum grant for individuals who live in Winfield Township and do not fit into other categories for assistance from the State or Federal Government. There is a work component to this grant. Must meet all requirements.

### Emergency Assistance

Emergency Assistance is administered to persons once in a twelve-month period with a lifetime max of 5 times. Applicant must be a Township resident who has received a five-day notice and/or utility disconnection notice. Must meet all financial and non-financial requirements.

### LIHEAP

LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) is a program that assists eligible households in paying their gas and or electric bills. Eligibility is determined by household size, income, and geographical location. This program runs through August 15, 2026 or until the funds run out.

### Wrap Up of Holiday Assistance Program

I want to give a huge thank you to all of our wonderful donors who make this program possible and helped create a truly special holiday season for our Winfield Township families in need.

This year, families invited to participate in the Holiday Assistance Program came through the Township Emergency Assistance Program. A total of **65 children** were "adopted" this holiday season, bringing joy to many households.

In a special highlight, **four children** (ages 7–11) had the unique opportunity to shop alongside our law enforcement officers. Each child was picked up from their home by an officer who volunteered their time to help shop for gifts for their family—a heartwarming experience for everyone involved.

## SPRING TIME REMINDERS

**CHIP PROGRAM** Call the Road District Office to be placed on the list for chip delivery. We start hauling around the first week of April.

### LAWN CARE

- Avoid excess watering of your lawn
- Sparingly use pesticides and fertilizers
- Use organic mulch
- Keep grass clippings off the road
- Sweep up and compost yard waste

### PERMITS (Unincorporated Areas)

## BRUSH PICK-UP

### UNINCORPORATED AREAS BRUSH PICK-UP

Start Dates: April 6   May 4   Sept 8   Oct 5  
(Day after Labor Day)

### UNINCORPORATED AREAS LEAF REMOVAL

Start date is Monday, November 16, 2026  
(Please follow the guidelines)

The Township Brush Removal Program is done 4 times a year. We pick up the first Monday in April and May and again in September (Tuesday after Labor Day) and October. We have a brush chipper designed to chip limbs and branches that do not qualify as yard waste. It is not designed to grind small twigs and evergreen trimmings. Your garbage service will take yard waste and roots nominal cost. Please remember, if it can be put into a yard bag, then it is yard waste.

**Secure your bundles with baling twine (not wire), if it is not bundled, we will not pick it up.**

**Bundles are not to exceed 50lbs in weight.**

**All Brush must be cut up to (6) feet and no larger than (6) inches in diameter.**

Please do not hide thorny tree branches inside piles. Place these next to larger piles and our crew will take them. They need special care; they can cause injury.

Not considered brush are logs, root balls, stumps, grass clippings, flowers, weeds, plans, leaves, lumber or anything in plastic bags or any such containers. This brush pick-up program is for the sole use of the residents of unincorporated Winfield Township and should not be used by contractors and/or residents clearing lots for homes, private roads, entrances or more open space.

Cutting down a tree is not considered to be trimming or pruning and the Township will not remove the debris.

**My name is Rick Gieser** and I am the DuPage Forest Preserve Commissioner for District 6.

Here is a brief update on Forest Preserve activity and information in Winfield Township.

The West Branch River Trail bridge over Roosevelt Road, just east of Route 59, is scheduled to begin construction in late spring/early summer. This trail will connect the West DuPage Forest Preserve with Blackwell Forest Preserve. This will strengthen the regional trail system in Winfield Township.

There will be a events all season long at the Kline Creek Farm...including sheep shearing on April 5th and a hand cow milking demonstrations on June 6, 7, 13, 14, 20, 21, 27 & 28. Our dedicated committee brings together board members, staff representatives, and mental health professionals from every area of our township to guide strategic initiatives, support programming, and ensure that mental health remains a priority in our planning and community outreach.

- In its first year we have completed our township mental health needs assessment
- We are reviewing current mental health programs and identifying areas for growth
- We are supporting the development of trauma-informed practices across departments
- Exploring partnerships with local mental health organizations
- Setting measurable goals for staff well-being and community impact

As we continue this year, the committee will play a key role in shaping upcoming training initiatives and contributing to policy development that prioritizes emotional health and resilience.

We look forward to sharing more progress in the coming months and welcome community input as we expand this important work.

In addition to the survey, the Board has convened a focus group with local mental health providers and gathered feedback from teens and community members to ensure a wide range of voices are represented. Your input helped shape priorities, identify gaps in services, and guide future investments in mental health and substance use programs.

## ILLINOIS PRAIRIE PATH ANNUAL TRAIL CLEAN UP
